



2018 CHS Credit Recovery Summer School Information

Summer School placements are predominately for English and Math courses. Other courses can only be taken in Summer School under special circumstances. For example, if a student fails a Science or Social Studies course, the student in most cases would be required to repeat that course the following year rather than qualify for Summer School. Typically, if a student fails 1 or 2 semesters of an English course, he/she will be recommended for Summer School due to the 4 years of English requirement. If a student fails a semester math course, his/her semester 2 performance will need to be taken into consideration first (Math is a 3 year requirement). Failing both semesters of a math course disqualifies a student from Summer School placement in most cases as the student would then need to be scheduled in and repeat the entire course the following school year.

Final Summer School recommendations will be made during the first week of June after Semester 2 grades have been posted. The RtI Team (*RtI Coordinator, Counselors, Administration*) will determine whether a course needs to be completed during the summer or if your child's 2018-19 schedule will be adjusted to include a failed course(s). At that time, if your son/daughter is officially recommended for Summer School, you will receive an email with specific information including the course(s) to be taken, general information and expectations, and the summer school grading policy.

- All Sessions will be held at Central Middle School from 9:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.
- Students must be present for 16 out of the 20 sessions. This allows for only 4 absences (or) 1 week of a planned family vacation. On the 5th absence, the student will be removed from the Summer School Program. Students who complete their course(s) prior to the last session are not required to attend any remaining sessions.
- Tardiness minutes will be accumulated and will be calculated as absences. Students who are more than 15 minutes late will not be permitted to attend that day's session and will receive a full day absence.
- All students must provide their own transportation to and from Central Middle School. Any student with a valid driver's license may drive, school year parking pass rules do not apply to Summer School.
- There is no charge for District 301 Summer School.
