## **MISSION STATEMENT**

## **COMMUNITY PROFILE**

Central High School is part of a district which serves the central portion of Kane County. The district primarily serves the far western portions of St. Charles and Elgin along with the communities of Burlington, Hampshire, Plato Center, Pingree Grove, Sycamore, Maple Park, and Lily Lake. This area is primarily residential, composed of both suburban housing and rural farms. There is little industry within the district.

## **SCHOOL**

Central High School is a public four-year comprehensive high school. Of the 257 graduates in June of 2018, 88.3 percent indicated they planned to continue their education at an institution of higher learning, 54 percent planned to attend a four-year school while 34.3 percent indicated they planned to attend a two-year school.

#### **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

A total of 23.5 credits are required for graduation in 2019. Most courses earn one-half credit per semester or one credit per year. The following course distribution is required:

#### **AP Exam Results**

In May 2018, 191 students took 304 AP exams with 207 earning a score of 3 or higher. Nineteen students were recognized as AP Scholars, 11 as AP Scholars with Honors, and 10 were recognized as AP Scholars with Distinction.

Grade Point Averages are calculated by dividing the total quality points earned by the number of credits attempted. Quality points are not affected by "+" or "-" grades.
